GUIDANCE NOTE ON IDENTIFYING GEOGRAPHICALLY ISOLATED AND DISADVANTAGED AREAS (GIDA) IN PANTAWID PAMILYANG PILIPINO PROGRAM

1. Rationale

Since its inception, Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program has been constantly responding to the most vulnerable sectors of the society especially the Indigenous Peoples (IP). Guided by its Indigenous Peoples Participation Framework (IPPF), the program conducted consultations among IP communities, leading to the development of Modified Conditional Cash Transfer-Indigenous Peoples in Geographically Isolated and Disadvantaged Areas (MCCT-IPs in GIDA), providing a more inclusive and responsive program to the indigenous peoples.

The term "Geographically Isolated and Disadvantaged Areas (GIDA)" was adopted from the DOH, NCIP & DILG Joint Memorandum Circular No. 2013 – 01 where it was defined as "Far-flung areas and marginalized populations which include islands, mountainous areas, conflict-affected areas (CAAs), internally-displaced persons (IDPs), and ICCs/IPs". For the benefit of the program, the definition was modified to refer to the IPs residing in communities with absence of access roads and hard-to-reach areas, absence of or limited opportunity for development, absence of or limited access to social services, and insufficient food security. At present, MCCT IPs in GIDA caters to 169,685 IP families.

With the institutionalization of Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program, "those in geographically isolated and disadvantaged areas" will be automatically included in the DSWD's standardized targeting system. Further, findings from the Joint Review Missions with the Development Partners revealed that households in GIDA, regardless of affiliation, are more vulnerable than those not in GIDA. Hence, there is a need to identify geographically isolated and disadvantaged areas accurately to ensure appropriate and individualized interventions within the seven-year program engagement leading to improved well-being.

Given the above-cited premises, along with the program's direction to integrate the MCCT beneficiary data including IPs in GIDA to Pantawid Pamilya Information System (PPIS), led to the development of this GIDA Guidance Note. This guidance note shall provide the necessary guidance to accurately identify and tag geographically isolated and disadvantaged areas in the Pantawid Pamilya Information System, thereby ensuring appropriate and individualized interventions.





2. Legal Bases

R.A. 11310: An Act Institutionalizing the Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program Section 6. Eligibile Beneficiaries – "Farmers, fisherfolks, homeless families, indigenous peoples, those in the informal settler sector and those in geographically isolated and disadvantaged areas including those in areas without electricity shall be automatically included in the standardized targeting by the household-beneficiary."

DOH Administrative Order 2020-23: Guidelines on Identifying Geographically-Isolated and Disadvantaged Areas and Strengthening their Health Systems

Defines the barangay as GIDA based on "both physical and socio-economic factors that limit the availability of and accessibility to basic health services among the population in that area."

Criteria for the classification of GIDA are as follows:

- Physical factor of a barangay at least 25% of sitio/purok should neither have an access to a Rural Health Unit (RHU) nor to a hospital within 60 minutes of travel in any form of transport, including walking;
- Socio-economic factor of a barangay specifically the provision that "at least 10% of its population are affected by armed conflict or internally displaced.."

MC 19 Series of 2014: Guidelines for the Pilot Implementation of the MCCT Program for Indigenous Peoples in Geographically Isolated and Disadvantaged Areas

Area Coverage - "Indigenous peoples in GIDA particularly those with:

- No or limited opportunities for development
- No or limited access to social services
- No access road or hard-to-reach areas
- Insufficiency of food security"

DOH-NCIP -DILG Joint Memorandum Circular No. 2013-01 Series of 2013

Definition of Terms – Geographically Isolated and Disadvantaged Areas (GIDA) "Far-flung areas and marginalized populations which include islands, mountainous areas, conflict affected areas (CAAs), internally displaced persons (IDP), and ICCs/IPs."

A.O. 7 Series of 2011: Guidelines in the Preparation of the Social Protection and Development Report (SPDR)

The SPDR aims to "identify the risks and vulnerabilities encountered by individuals, families and communities" in order to prioritize the major risks and vulnerabilities given the limited resources of the government.





Aside from the identification of risk, the SPDR aims to identify the prevalence of risk as well as the identification of vulnerable groups such as IPs, and prevalence of their vulnerability. Further, the SPDR defines risk and vulnerability assessment as "the measurement or estimation of being at-risk and vulnerable at any potentially harmful event".

Enhanced Social Protection Framework of the Philippines

The Enhanced Social Protection Framework of the Philippines aims to improve the quality of life for all Filipinos by (i) reducing poverty, inequality, and vulnerability; and (ii) including the marginalized and raising their social status. The framework seeks to mitigate (i) lifecycle and individual risks; (ii) environmental, natural, and human-induced risks; (iii) economic risks; and (iv) social and governance risks. The framework emphasizes the critical role of the 4Ps in reducing poverty and promoting development. The framework highlights social protection as a basic human right and notes the critical role of local governments in implementing the program.

3. Objective

The GIDA Guidance Note aims to assess and tag identified geographically isolated and disadvantaged areas (GIDA) in Pantawid Pamilya Information System to ensure appropriate and individualized interventions.

Specifically, it aims to:

- Revisit and revalidate existing geographically isolated and disadvantaged areas;
- Identify other GIDAs among Pantawid;
- Provide guidance and tools for proper identification of geographically isolated and disadvantaged areas; and,
- Specify roles and responsibilities of program staff involved in the assessment.

4. Scope and Coverage

The GIDA Guidance Note shall apply to all Pantawid areas both under MCCT and RCCT. Areas identified as GIDA during the first assessment shall be reassessed every after two (2) years.

The GIDA Assessment shall be administered at the *barangay*-level with its farthest sitio as the point of reference.

5. Definition of Terms

Armed Conflict – refers to a contested incompatibility that concerns government and/or territory where the use of armed force between two parties, of which at least one is the government of a state, results in at least 25 battle-related deaths in one calendar year¹.

Calamity - a disastrous event marked by great loss and lasting distress and suffering²

Food threshold – refers to minimum income/ expenditure required for a family/ individual to meet the basic food needs which satisfies the nutritional requirements for economically necessary and socially desirable physical activities³

Geographically Isolated and Disadvantaged (GIDA) Barangay – refers to a "community with marginalized population physically and socio-economically separated from the mainstream society". GIDA barangays are also those with GIDA sitio or "pockets of households far from the barangay center, and with no discernible roads for motor vehicles to pass"

These GIDA Sitios within GIDA barangays are identified to be located beyond the 500-meter radius from the "discernable center" of the barangay where social service facilities congregate. The farther away the GIDA sitio is from the discernable center, the harder it is for the households to access the social services available in the barangay.

Hazard - a situation with the potential to induce "harm, damage to property, damage to the environment, or a combination of these⁶." Hazards may be natural, or anthropogenic/human-induced in origin. Natural hazards are predominantly associated with natural processes and phenomena. Anthropogenic hazards, or human-induced hazards, are induced entirely or predominantly by human activities and choices⁷.

Indigenous Peoples (IP) - refer to a group of people or homogenous societies identified by self-ascription and ascription by others, who have continuously lived as organized community on communally bounded and defined territory, and who have, under claims of ownership since time immemorial, occupied, possessed and utilized such territories, sharing common bonds of language, customs, traditions and other distinctive cultural traits, or who have, through resistance to political, social and cultural inroads of colonization, non-indigenous religions and cultures, became historically differentiated from the majority of Filipinos.⁸

Multigrade classes – classes with multiple grade levels inside a single classroom and handled by the same teacher. These are commonly conducted in far-flung areas where students are smaller in number.

Risks – refer to uncertain events that may damage someone's well-being towards becoming poor⁹

Vulnerabilities – refer to probabilities to become poor in the future 10

6. GIDA Assessment Implementing Guide

The GIDA Assessment is recommended to be administered at the Barangay level with its farthest sitio as the point of reference. Areas identified as GIDA shall be reassessed every after two (2) years to ensure updated classification. The assessment shall be facilitated by the Community Facilitator/City/Municipal Link either through a barangay assembly or focus group discussions ensuring that all sitio/purok and sectors are well represented especially those belonging to indigenous groups, women, and youth. The assessment shall utilize the GIDA Assessment Tool (Annex A) and GIDA Rating Guide (Annex B).

The result of the assessment shall be reviewed and consolidated by the Provincial Link/SWO III and submitted to the Regional Program Management Office (RPMO) for consolidation using the GIDA Assessment Summary (Annex C) and submission to the NPMO. The NPMO shall then facilitate the tagging of GIDA and non-GIDA on Pantawid Information Systems based on the submission of field offices. For the detailed institutional arrangement, please refer to section VII of this guidance note.

Result of GIDA assessment shall be utilized for the provision of appropriate interventions thru case management and/or community organizing. The result of the assessment is recommended to be shared with Local Government Units (LGU) and other stakeholders either thru advisory committee meetings or other venues, for the provision of appropriate interventions. Caution should be observed however, against possible alteration or manipulation.

6.1. GIDA Assessment Tool and Rating Guide

The GIDA Assessment Tool is divided into two (2) sections: **Geographic Isolation** and **Area Vulnerabilities**. Each section has a set of indicators which are rated based on the GIDA Rating Guide. GIDA Assessment Tool and Rating Guide per indicator are further discussed below.

This section aims to identify the geographic isolation of the barangay by identifying the following:

- A.1. Distance of the Farthest Sitio of the Barangay from the Barangay Hall;
- A.2. Distance of the Farthest Sitio of the Barangay from the Rural Health Unit;
- **A.3.** Distance of the Farthest Sitio of the Barangay from the Nearest Public Education Facility: and.
- A.4. Distance of the Farthest Sitio of the Barangay from the Nearest Market.

The farthest sitio within a barangay is the point of reference for defining geographic isolation. This is done to account the presence of GIDA sitios within a barangay and to be consistent with DOH guidelines which focus on the access of sitio/purok to the Rural Health Units.

Distance is measured in this section by looking into the primary and secondary modes transportation from the farthest sitio of the barangay. **Primary mode of transportation** is the dominant mode of transportation used by the majority of the population. **Secondary mode of transportation** is the alternative mode of transport when the primary mode of transportation is either not available due to certain weather conditions, or the alternative mode of transportation becomes more convenient in certain season (e.g. use of boat in some areas during monsoon). To rate the geographic isolation, please refer to the rating guide below per indicator found in columns.

In all indicators measuring distances, the tool below shall be used:

B. AREA VULNERABILITIES

This section aims to identify the vulnerabilities in the area such as the quality of social services (health and education); accessibility and quality of basic utilities; socioeconomic situation (livelihood, prices of products and basic commodities); and lastly, the intensity and effect of natural and human-induced hazards.

Per A.O. 7 Series of 2011: Guidelines in the Preparation of the Social Protection and Development Report (SPDR), vulnerability is the probability of families or households to become poor in the future. Further, SPDR recognizes the vulnerability of special sectors such as the indigenous peoples.

B.1. Social Services

This indicator specifically looks into the quality of health and education services in the most accessible facilities from the farthest sitio of the barangay.





B.1.1. Quality of Health Services

Specific to health service, the community should identify the top 3 health facilities most accessible from the farthest sitio of the barangay. Facility ownership, distance, service capability, and availability of health personnel and facilities shall be rated per health facility based on the following tool and rating guide.

B.1.2. Quality of Education Services

This indicator looks into the facility ownership; distance; presence of multigrade classes; availability of teaching staff; and, availability and condition of materials, facilities and equipment per education facility. For this indicator, the community shall identify two (2) facilities per level: Early Childhood Care and Development (ECCD), Kinder and Elementary School, High School, Senior High School, and Alternative Learning System/Alternative Delivery Mode (ALS/ADM) which are most accessible from the farthest sitio of the barangay.

B.3.2. Prices of Farm and other Products from the Farthest sitio of the Barangay

This indicator looks into the prices of farm and other products from the farthest sitio of the barangay as compared to its prices in the municipal market. Top 5 farm and other products from the farthest sitio, its average price when sold in the barangay proper, and its average price in the municipal market should be filled-out by the field worker.
